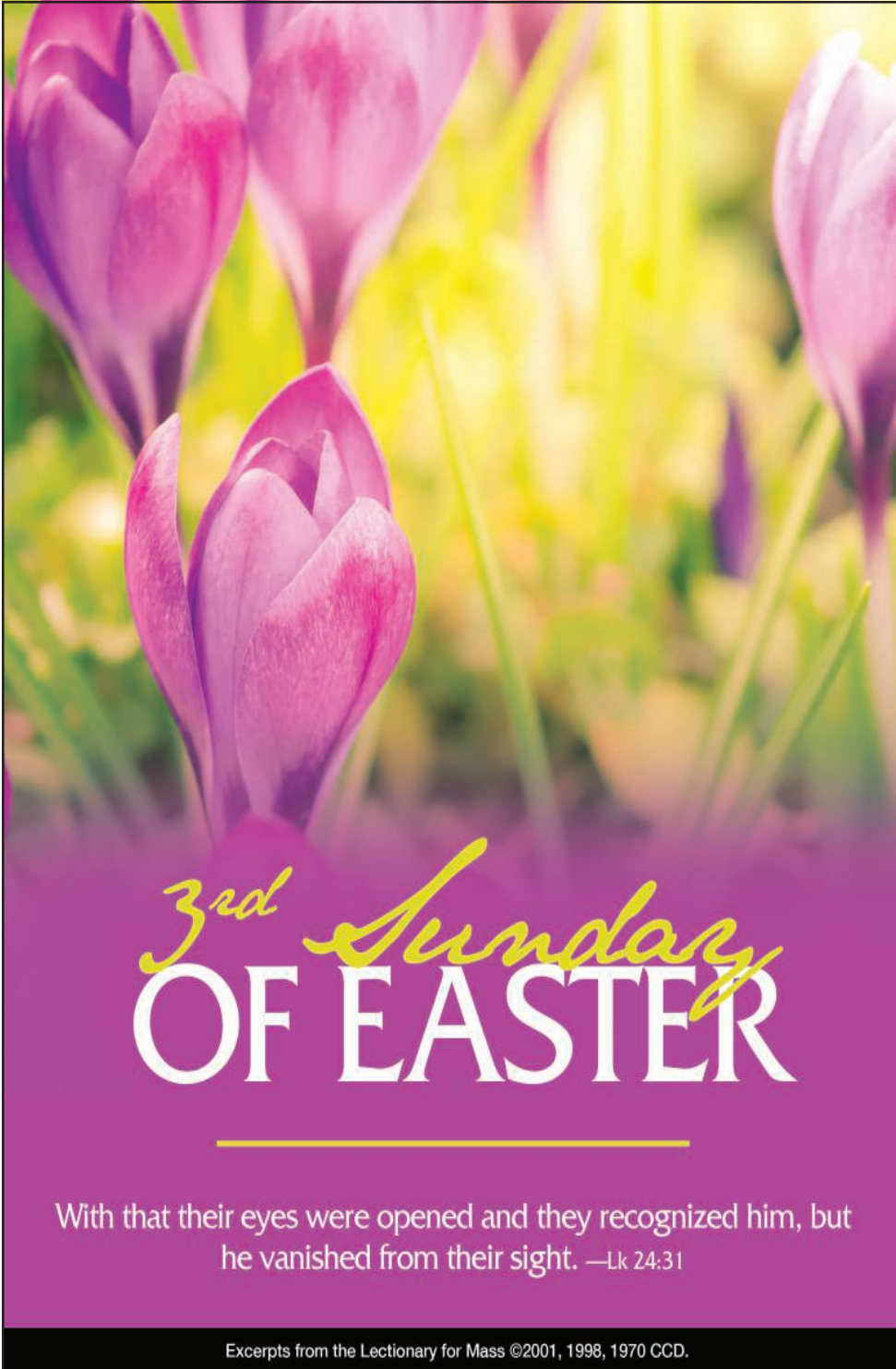

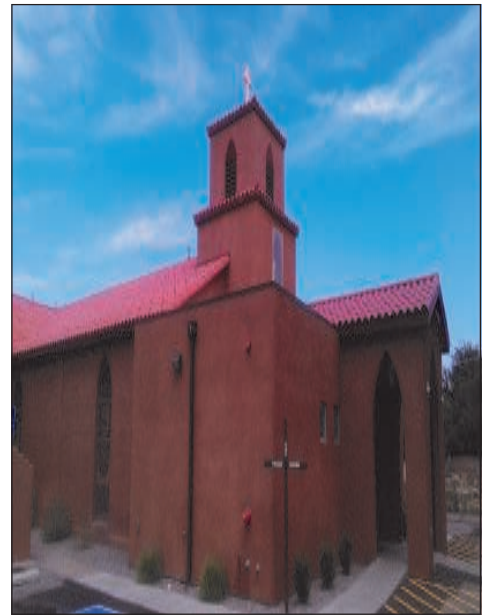

THE CREED

44. How does the word, "incarnation" apply to Jesus? He is called the "Incarnate Word" because he is the Word of God made man, born of the Virgin Mary at Bethlehem, in the nation of Israel.

45. What is the significance of the name, "Jesus"? This-name given by the angel Gabriel at the Annunciation means "God saves."

46. Has anyone else ever been given this Name? No, because "there is no other name under Heaven given among men by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12).

47. Why do we add the word "Christ" when saying Jesus' name? For two reasons: "Christ" in Hebrew means "anointed one" and in Greek means "messiah."

48. What does it mean to refer to Jesus Christ as "lord"? The word "lord" means sovereign, and we know from the New Testament that Jesus demonstrated, on many occasions, his sovereignty over nature, over sin, and over death through his own Resurrection.

49. What is meant by the Immaculate Conception? It means that Jesus was conceived in his mother Mary's womb by the "power of the Holy Spirit" and not by relations with a man.

50. Did the Blessed Mother retain her virginity even though she gave birth to Jesus? Yes, precisely because she did not have relations with a man, that is, Jesus did not have a human father.

51. Did Jesus have any siblings through Mary and Joseph? No, the "brothers and sisters" spoken of in Scripture were not siblings but, rather, extended family relations.

52. What is meant by the "hidden life" of Jesus? The "hidden life" of Jesus is a reference to the silence of Scripture on Jesus' life as a boy and a young man in his days with the Holy Family at Nazareth.

53. What is Church teaching regarding Jesus life at home with his mother and foster father? Jesus' life as a child must have been unexceptional in daily routine; a very simple, humble existence centering on obedience, fellowship, friends, prayer and hard work all wrapped in the loving arms and devotion of Jesus and Mary.

STAY WITH US, LORD!

We read in today's Gospel the very beautiful story of the disciples at Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35). Here we find the earnest supplication: "Stay with us, because it is towards evening, and the day is now far spent." Stay with us, Lord! It is the cry of the soul who has found its God and never again wishes to be separated from Him. Let us too, as the disciples at Emmaus, go in search of the Lord. Our whole life is a continuous journey toward Him. We are often sad, even as the two disciples were, because we do not initially succeed in finding Him. Because, not understanding His mysterious ways, it seems that He has abandoned us. "We hoped that it was He that should have redeemed Israel...but...," said the two disciples, frustrated by the death of Jesus, and not perceiving that Jesus, at the very moment when they were about to relinquish all hope, was there close to them, disguised as their fellow traveler. We have often shared this experience of Him. Hidden in the obscurity of faith, God draws near our soul, makes Himself our traveling companion, and still more, lives in us by grace. It is true that here below Jesus does not reveal Himself in the clarity of the "face to face" vision which is reserved for eternity; we see Him only as "through a glass in a dark manner" (1 Cor. 13:12); nevertheless, God knows how to make Himself known. To us, as to the disciples at Emmaus, His Presence is revealed in an obscure manner; yes, but unmistakably, because of the unique ardor which He alone can kindle in our hearts. "Was not our heart burning within us whilst He spoke in that way?" The soul who has found the Lord, even but once in this manner, not outside itself, but within itself, living and acting in its heart, cannot fail to direct to Him a cry: "Stay with me!" Yet this cry is already heard, it is already a permanent reality, because God always dwells with a soul in the state of grace. God is always with us, even when we do not feel Him, even when we do not notice His Presence. God is there, God remains with us; it is for us to remain with Him. If at certain moments He permits Himself to be recognized by our soul, He does so just to invite us to dwell with Him in His intimacy. Let us, therefore, beg Jesus ardently: teach us, O Lord, to stay with You, to live with You. Just as physical hunger is an indication of a living, healthy organism; spiritual hunger is an indication of a robust spirit, one that is active and continually developing. The soul which feels no hunger for God, no need to seek Him and find Him, and which does not vibrate or suffer with anxiety in its search, does not bear within it the signs of the Resurrection. The Pascal *alleluia* is a cry of triumph at Christ's Resurrection, but at the same time it is an urgent invitation for us to rise also. Like the sound of reveille, it calls us to the battles of the spirit, and invites us to rouse and renew ourselves, to participate ever more profoundly in Christ's Resurrection. God has made us for Himself, and we cannot live without Him; we need Him, we hunger and thirst for Him; He is the only One who can satisfy our hearts. The more the soul revives itself in the Resurrection of Christ, the more it feels the need of God and of heavenly truths; it detaches itself more and more from earthly things to turn toward those of heaven.
