


CATHOLIC IDENTITY/RELIGIOUS EDUCATION BASIC CATECHESIS-KEN CANTWELL-DRE 07/16/17 Law and Morality (Cont)

- 64. Define detraction. An intentional attempt to embarrass or ruin another person by revealing their secret faults to friends or the general public.
- 65. Define pernicious gossip. Quite possibly one of the worst sins because the lies or idle talk engaged in has no basis in fact. It is a blatant attempt to destroy another person usually because you just don't like them.
- 66. What is the smallest muscle in the human body? The smallest muscle is the tongue, which has the largest power to destroy lives with the smallest lie.
- 67. What is the Ninth Commandment of God? YOU SHALL NOT COVET YOUR NEIGHBOR'S WIFE.
- 68. Define the word, "Covet." The word, covet, means to desire something or someone that belongs to another.
- 69. What does the ninth commandment forbid? The ninth commandment prohibits the mere idea or actual thinking about another's wife as your own temporarily or permanently.
- 70. In what other way does this commandment apply? This commandment covers, as well, the sins of impure or immodest thoughts either by direct association, or by encouraging immodesty or impurity in dress and speech through bad example.
- 71. What is the Tenth Commandment of God? YOU SHALL NOT COVET YOUR NEIGHBOR'S GOODS.
- 72. What does the tenth commandment forbid? Again, like the ninth commandment, one is forbidden to even think about another's goods or possessions as your own.

Under no circumstances may we contradict His divine will by asserting our own selfish desires above His.

OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL

The Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, celebrated on July 16, was first instituted in the late 14th century. Earlier historical records from the 12th century record a community of monks living on Mount Carmel, a mountain overlooking the Mediterranean Sea on which the Old Testament prophet Elijah successfully challenged the priest of Baal and won the people to the true God. Despite continual difficulties, the community built a monastery and church dedicated to the Virgin Mary on Mount Carmel in 1263. Mount Carmel was taken by the Muslims in 1291, and the brothers were killed and the monastery burned. The spread of the Carmelites in Europe is largely attributed to the work of Saint Simon Stock (1247-1265). The Brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, according to Carmelite tradition, was presented by Our Lady to St. Simon Stock, the then Father General on July 16, 1251. A scapular, historically was a long piece of cloth that goes over one's head, and hangs down the front and back (many religious orders still wear these). "Scapular" comes from the Latin scapula which means "shoulder." That makes sense since the scapular rests on one's shoulders. Today, lay people who wear a scapular usually wear one with two small pieces of brown wool, connected by cord or ribbon that hangs down one's front and back. Mary's promise that accompanies this scapular is that the person who wears it with faith "will not suffer everlasting fire." However, we must be in a state of grace at the moment of death. Another important aspect of wearing the Scapular is the Sabbatine Privilege. This concerns a promise made by Our Lady to Pope John XXII. In a papal letter he issued, he recounted a vision that he had had. He stated that the Blessed Virgin had said to him in this vision, concerning those who wear the Brown Scapular: "I, the Mother of Grace, shall descend on the Saturday after their death and whomsoever I shall find in Purgatory, I shall free, so that I may lead them to the holy mountain of life everlasting." Many popes and saints have strongly recommended wearing the Brown Scapular to the Catholic Faithful. Pope John Paul II, who is reported to have worn a brown scapular since he was a boy, insisted doctors not remove his scapular during surgery following the assassination attempt in May 1981. Father Mariano Cera, a Carmelite priest, told Inside the Vatican magazine: "Just before the Holy Father was operated on, he told the doctors, 'don't take off the scapular.' And the surgeons left it on." In his message to the Carmelites at the 750th anniversary of the bestowal of the scapular by Our Lady, Pope John Paul II said those who wear the scapular—or habit, as he called it—dedicated themselves to the service of Our Lady for the good of the whole Church. "Devotion to her," he continued, "cannot be limited to prayers and tributes in her honor on certain occasions, but must become a 'habit,' that is, a permanent orientation of one's own Christian conduct, woven of prayer and interior life, through frequent reception of the sacraments and the concrete practice of the spiritual and corporal works of mercy." In order to receive the spiritual blessings associated with the Scapular, it is necessary to be formally enrolled in the Brown Scapular. The enrollment is made only once by a priest, usually at one's First Holy Communion. A scapular can be a constant reminder that we "have put on Christ" in our Baptismal promises. It is a sign which has been approved by the Church for over seven centuries and which stands for the decision to: follow Jesus like Mary; be open to God and to His will; be guided by faith, hope and love; to pray at all times, especially the Rosary; and to discover God present in all that happens around us.
