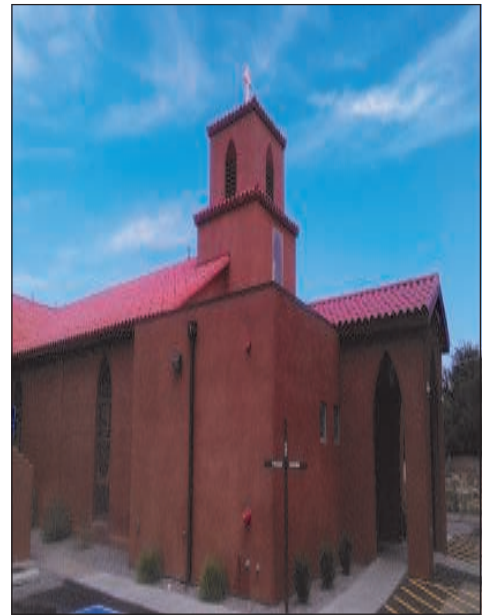

Law and Morality (Cont)

THE COMMANDMENTS (Precepts) OF THE CHURCH

74. Define the word "precept." A precept is a basic rule that must be observed to identify as Catholic.

75. Are there any other rules one observes as a Catholic?

Yes, there are 1700 rules which make up the body of Church law known as Canon Law.

76. What does the word "canon" mean? A canon is a set of rules or standards of behavior that regulates human conduct.

77. Name the Six Commandments (PRECEPTS) of the Church. They are:

1. Attend Mass on Sundays and Holy days of obligation.
2. Receive Holy Communion during the Easter Season.
3. Confess your sins at least once a year.
4. Fast and abstain on the days appointed.
5. Observe the laws of marriage.
6. Contribute to the support of the Church.

78. What is the First Precept of the Church? **ATTEND MASS ON SUNDAYS AND HOLY DAYS OF OBLIGATION.**

79. Explain the first precept of the Church. Catholics are required, under the pain of mortal sin, to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.

80. Does this rule afford any exceptions? Yes, one may miss Mass or a Holy Day for legitimate reasons, such as illness, travel or family emergency.

81. What should a Catholic do if he willfully misses Mass on Sunday or a Holy Day? At the first opportunity, he is bound to confess his sin in the sacrament of Reconciliation.

THE PRECIOUS BLOOD OF CHRIST

Did you know the month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood? The devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Church Fathers said that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood. "The Precious Blood which we worship is the Blood which the Savior shed for us on Calvary and reassumed at His glorious Resurrection; it is the Blood which courses through the veins of Christ's risen, glorified, living Body at the right hand of God the Father in heaven; it is the Blood made present on our altars by the words of Consecration in the Mass; it is the Blood which merited sanctifying grace for us and through it, washes and beautifies our soul and inaugurates the beginning of eternal life in it." Because one drop of the Precious Blood of Jesus is enough to redeem all sinners, each Mass has, in fact, infinite value to free us from sin and unite us to God the Father. For during each Mass, we offer ourselves in union with Jesus Christ who, through the priest, offers Himself to the Father in the Holy Spirit. However, if the Precious Blood is capable of bringing salvation to all sinners, why—if we receive Holy Communion and participate in the Mass every Sunday—are we not all saints (yet)? Vatican II emphasized that in order for the Liturgy—with all the power of the Triune God made present—to "produce in full effects, it is necessary that the faithful come to the Mass with proper dispositions, that their minds should be attuned to their voices, and that they should cooperate with divine grace lest they receive it in vain" (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, 11). Thus, we have to be ready to receive all these graces that God wants to pour out on us in the Mass! This is what a visionary from Bolivia saw in a vision of our guardian angels during the Mass. She saw some carrying golden bowls shining with light to the altar during the Offertory. These were the guardian angels of people offering their hearts and intentions in the Holy Mass and were conscious of what the celebration of the Mass meant. Our Lady said to the visionary, "Offer yourselves at this moment; offer your sorrows, your pains, your hopes, your sadness, your joys, your petitions. Remember that the Mass has infinite value. Therefore, be generous in offering and in asking." Another group of angels had nothing in their hands going up to the altar. These were the guardian angels of those who did not offer anything in the Mass and had no interest in the Mass. Lastly, at the end of the procession of angels were angels who were sad, with their hands joined in prayer and their eyes downcast—these were the angels of those who had come to Mass but did not want to be there and were forced to be there out of obligation. These people did not have any desire to participate in the Mass and their angels had nothing to offer to the Lord at the altar. The Blessed Mother said, "Do not sadden your Guardian Angel. Ask for much, ask for the conversion of sinners, for peace in the world, for your families, your neighbors, for those who ask for your prayers. Ask, ask for much, but not only for yourselves, but for everyone else...Remember that the offering which most pleases the Lord is when you offer yourselves as a holocaust so that Jesus, upon His descent, may transform you by His own merits. What do you have to offer by yourselves? Nothingness and sin. But the offering of oneself united to the merits of Jesus, that offering is pleasing to the Father." This is the goal of the Eucharist: that man might enter into communion with God. Just as the bread and wine are transformed by the Holy Spirit to become the Body and Precious Blood of Christ, so we, too, are transformed ever more into the Body of Christ, the Church, at each Mass. The offering that Jesus makes to the Father is no longer of Himself alone on Calvary, but of Himself in union with His Body, the Church, throughout the whole world throughout all of history!
