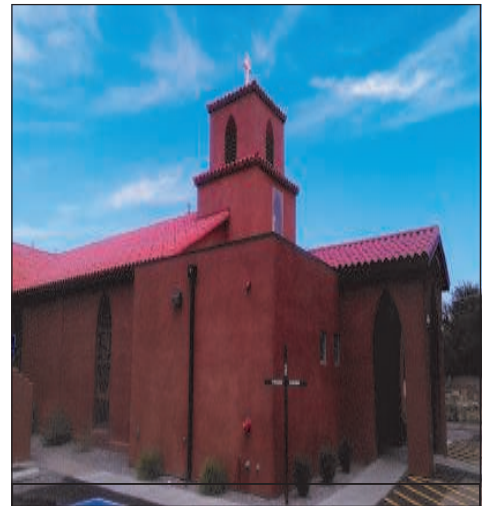

SACRAMENTS-CONFIRMATION (CONT'D)

141. How can this be stated even more emphatically? The purpose, the need for, the true function of Confirmation is to demonstrate to the world the place of the Third Person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit, in God's overall plan of salvation.

142. But isn't the primary role of the Holy Spirit to guide and protect the Church? Yes, and in so doing, he becomes the guide and protector of each member of the Church, whence his title, Paraclete, which is the Greek word for Advocate.

143. How is this singular importance of the Holy Spirit defined biblically? In Christ's own words, we read in John's gospel, chapter 6 verse 63, "It is the spirit that gives life, while the Flesh is of no avail. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and life."

144. How does the Holy Spirit come to work in our lives? Again, from Jesus who says in John 14:23 "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him." These words conform perfectly to Jesus' words to his Apostles before his ascension when he said, "I will not leave you orphaned, I will send you my Spirit ..."

145. What bible reference supports this promise of Jesus to send the Holy Spirit? In Acts 1: 4: While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." -

PREPARE THE WAY OF THE LORD

Saint John the Baptist was sent to announce, "Prepare the way of the Lord" (Mk 1:3). In Advent, we do exactly that: We wait and we hope for Jesus, giving testimony to the Light coming into the world. But which coming do we prepare for? People often think we're only getting ready to celebrate the birth of Jesus, but actually that's not all! In Advent, we prepare for ALL three comings of Christ: the Incarnation; the Second Coming of Christ; and Jesus's entry into our hearts through the Sacraments and prayer. So yes, in Advent, we prepare for the coming of Jesus. And a key element to preparing the way of the Lord is penance, which enables us to share in the Cross of Christ. As Fr. John Hardon, SJ, used to say, "Love and suffering are inseparable." Many have forgotten that Advent is a penitential season, and used to be a full 40-day fast like Lent. (The Orthodox Church still observes that fast). By performing fasting and penance in Advent, we prepare to celebrate Christmas with clean hearts and minds by offering reparation for our sins, strengthening our weakened wills, mortifying our disordered desires, and renewing our minds (see Rom 12:2). So when does the true Christmas season start? If you listen to the commercials and the media, Advent is the Christmas season. For them, Christmas begins the day after Thanksgiving, when the gift buying season begins, and ends after Christmas Day. Actually, the opposite is true. The Christmas season begins on the Vigil of Christmas—Christmas Eve—and ends in January, on the Solemnity of the Baptism of Our Lord, which is the Sunday after the Solemnity of the Epiphany (when we celebrate the manifestation of Our Lord during the visit of the Three Magi). This is the true Christmas season, when we ought to have Christmas decorations all around the house. Christmas to Epiphany (or Little Christmas) is 12 days—traditionally called "Christmastide," or the 12 Days of Christmas (think of the Christmas carol). You probably notice that the Church does not celebrate or decorate for Christmas until the Christmas Eve Vigil. There is, however, one particular Advent decoration: the Advent wreath. Its shape is a circle, with no beginning and no end, to symbolize eternity. The wreath is made out of evergreen, so named because it always stays green, and thus symbolizes eternal life. We light candles on the wreath because Christ is the Light of the World. Those four candles symbolized hope, faith, joy, and peace. The purple candles represent penance, but the one rose candle (lit on Gaudete Sunday in the third week of Advent) represents joy. It's like this little oasis in the desert of fasting and penitential season. As the days grow darker, we light more candles, showing the light of Christ is shining over the horizon, that once again, a people in darkness are seeing a great light (see Mt 4:16). We have hope; Christ is coming. When we light the rose candle, we're within two weeks of Christmas. Catholic families are encouraged to also have an Advent wreath in their homes. So in this Advent season, let us pray to our great saints and with our Catholic brethren for hope, faith, joy, and peace for ourselves and our world. Let us be prepared to worthily receive the gifts of God, especially the Incarnate Divine Mercy. Happy Advent! (Written by Fr. Joseph, MIC, Marian Helper Magazine Winter 2017-18. marian.org).
