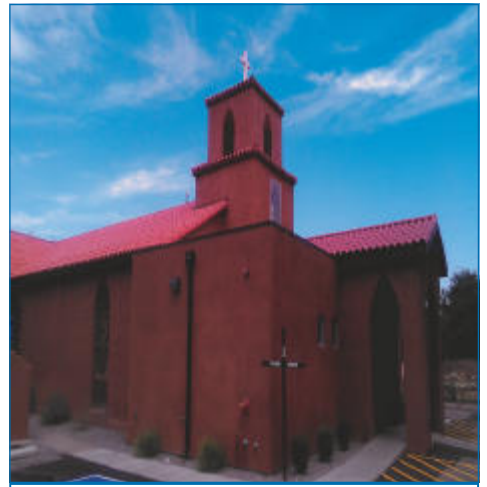

ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST'S VOCATION

Nearly every saint has a feast day on the calendar that marks the date of their death because that is the day on which they entered eternal life in heaven. Blessed Mother Mary and John the Baptist are both exceptions to this rule. We have feast days for both of their births and deaths because of their proximity to the most important event in human history—the birth, death, and resurrection of Jesus. We celebrate John the Baptist's birthday every June 24 (6 months before Christmas) because he came to announce to the world the coming of our Savior. The feast of the birth of John the Baptist is one of the oldest feasts in the calendar. It falls just after the summer solstice, at the moment when the days start to get noticeably shorter (until the return of the sun at the birth of Jesus at Christmas). Saint Augustine thought that this was appropriate because when John's followers were disturbed that people were following Jesus instead of John, he replied, "He must increase, but I must decrease." John's vocation was teacher, martyr and prophet—the last prophet, in fact. His birth was foretold to his father, Zachary, who was a priest, when an angel appeared to him while he was offering sacrifice and prayers before the altar. Though his wife, Elizabeth, was infertile, and they were both approaching old age, she conceived and bore a son and they named him John. John became a hermit and lived in the desert, fasting and praying. When he was 30, he began preaching and encouraging people to repentance and conversion, and he used the ritual washing of baptism to symbolize spiritual cleansing. When Jesus began his ministry, he came to John, who baptized Him and submitted to His authority. John continued to preach as Jesus went through Galilee. When John spoke out against King Herod's adultery, the king had him arrested, and he was eventually beheaded. John the Baptist is often depicted with a lamb because he identified Jesus as "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world."

PARENTS' PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS: Heavenly Father, "from whom every family in heaven and on earth takes its name" (Eph 3:15), we ask You to bless our family and each child You have given us in Your immense mercy. We entrust and consecrate them to You for Your greater glory and ask that You enkindle in them the fire of Your Holy Spirit so that they may fully embrace the call to salvation that You have made to each one of us. Above all, bestow upon them the Spirit's gifts of wisdom and understanding, so that they may be able to discern their proper calling in life and their particular pathway for dedicating themselves to the work of Your Kingdom. Grant them also a spirit of deep generosity and faith as they consider how best to serve You with the gift of their lives. We, their parents, promise to be stewards of their vocations in all the ways that are humanly possible: by teaching them Your Truth, by nurturing them with Your sacraments, and by magnifying Your voice in their hearts. You are the One who calls them, Father, and we are the servants of that call. We wish to be like John the Baptist who echoed Your word to the people and then humbly "decreased" in order that You would "increase" in their lives. So may we help our children by pointing out the way, teaching them to listen, and encouraging them to respond fearlessly to Your unique vocation for each of them. Allow us to be joyful witnesses, in our married life, to the truth that only in following Your call will they find true happiness in this world, despite its sorrows, and complete happiness in the world to come. And if it by Your will, Father most holy, we ask that You bless our family with the gift of a vocation to the priesthood or religious life for Your beloved Church. We are in no way worthy of such a gift. We only know that You give gratuitously out of the abundance of Your mercy to those who ask, and we beg with all our being for a gift so close to the Hearts of Christ and His Blessed Mother, Mary most holy. What a joy it would be for us to give back to You a child specially consecrated to Your mission of saving souls. May You be blessed in all Your angels and saints, and in all Your ministers, loving Father, now and for all ages, world without end. AMEN. (www.FaithND.edu and www.vocationboom.com)

CHURCH HISTORY (CONT)

THE PROTESTANT REFORMATION

158. How did corruption in the Church due to bad clergy, (ordained during the Black Plague) bring about the protestant revolt? The defining issue involved the selling of indulgences (sin of simony) by clergy ostensibly for rebuilding St. Peter's Basilica, but really to fatten their own wallets.

159. What is the Black Death? A disease of the glandular system characterized by high fever and swelling, highly infectious and spreads rapidly.

160. What is an indulgence? An indulgence is granted by the Church for the remission of temporal Punishment due to sin already forgiven in Confession.

161. How many kinds of indulgences are there? Two: plenary--- remission of all temporal punishment due to sins, and partial--- remission of part of the temporal punishment due to sins.

162. What are the conditions attached to indulgences? An indulgence, which is normally proclaimed by a bishop or the Pope, usually requires Mass attendance, confession, Communion and some additional prayer and/or good deed.

163. How did the issue of indulgences lead to the cataclysmic upheaval of Christendom that was the Protestant Reformation? It began with Pope Julius II (1503-13) wanting to fund the rebuilding of St. Peter's Basilica.

164. What was the Pope Julius indulgence? Any Catholic who goes to Confession, Holy Communion and makes a donation to St. Peter's construction would receive a plenary indulgence.

165. What fact is crucial to understanding indulgences? The recipient cannot continue to commit the same sins using the indulgence as a means of justification and forgiveness; one must be in the state of grace or the indulgence is invalid; a person cannot buy their way to heaven.

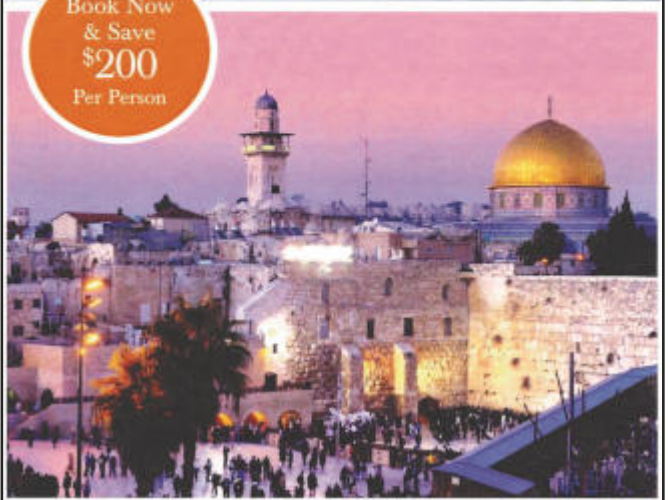
